The Lord Will Provide

SCRIPTURE: Genesis 22:1-14; Matthew 6:25-33;
1 Kings 17:1-14; (Matthew 6:25-33)

MEMORY VERSE: (Choose one of the following)

- Isaiah 65:24— Before they call I will answer; while they are still speaking I will hear.*
- Matthew 6:33— But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.*

KEY THEMES:

- God foresees our needs and He provides for us.
- God is able to fully provide for us because He not only has all of creation at His disposal, but He also has the inexhaustible resource of Himself.
- Believing that God will provide enables us to sacrifice without reservation (helps us to give freely without holding back).

PRONUNCIATION: JEHOVAH-JIREH—je hoh vuh jeh ruh

IDEAS FOR PARENT FOLLOW-UP:

1. Help your child memorize the memory verse.
2. Read the above scriptures, and think about the key themes.
3. *Deuteronomy 6:6, 7* instructs us, "These words...shall be upon your hearts...Talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise." Therefore, in the everyday circumstances of life, when you are driving in the car, eating a meal, performing a chore or any of the multitude of activities in which parents and children are engaged together, speak of Jehovah-Jireh, the God who provides for His children.
4. Pray that your child trusts in God's provision and that he cultivates a heart of thankfulness to God.
5. Encourage your child to complete his take home sheet.

EL ROI, The God Who Sees

SCRIPTURE: Genesis 16:1-13; Psalm 121

MEMORY VERSE: (Choose one of the following)

2 Chronicles 16:9a—For the eyes of the LORD range throughout the earth to strengthen those whose hearts are fully committed to him.
Proverbs 15:3—The eyes of the LORD are everywhere, keeping watch on the wicked and the good.

1 Peter 3:12 (Psalm 34:15) For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are attentive to their prayer, but the face of the Lord is against those who do evil.
Psalm 33:18—But the eyes of the LORD are on those who fear him, on those whose hope is in his unfailing love.

Psalm 121—I lift up my eyes to the hills—where does my help come from? My help comes from the LORD, the Maker of heaven and earth. He will not let your foot slip, he who watches over you will not slumber; indeed, he who watches over Israel will neither slumber nor sleep. The LORD watches over you—the LORD is your shade at your right hand; the sun will not harm you by day, nor the moon by night. The LORD will keep you from all harm—he will watch over your life; the LORD will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore.

KEY THEMES:

- God sees “deeper” than man does; He sees beyond the surface.
- God looks upon His creation with eyes of compassion.
- God sees everything; nothing is outside His watchful care.

PRONUNCIATION: EL ROI—el roy

IDEAS FOR PARENT FOLLOW-UP:

1. Help your child memorize the memory verse.
2. Read the above scriptures, and think about the key themes.
3. *Deuteronomy 6:6, 7* instructs us, “These words...shall be upon your hearts...Talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.” Therefore, in the everyday circumstances of life, when you are driving in the car, eating a meal, performing a chore or any of the multitude of activities in which parents and children are engaged together, bring El Roi. The God Who Sees, into your conversation. For example: If your son complains of a skinned knee, remind him that El Roi sees him and looks upon him with eyes of compassion.
4. Pray that your child sees God as El Roi.
5. Encourage your child to complete his take home sheet.
